#### June 21st: Summer Solstice



























# Animals of





Harbor seals are 'pinnipeds' which means they have flippers instead of feet. They spend about half their time underwater and can even sleep underwater. They are incredible divers, diving as deep as 1000 feet.



**Sea gulls** make nests by hollowing out a soft spot in the sand. They try to choose an area near grass, rocks or logs for protection. After chicks hatch, one parent stays with the nest all the time. The other parent brings food.



Found in the waters of Alaska, the **Tanner crab**, also known as 'Bairdi crab'. Their diet consists of worms, crabs, shrimp and fish. They can be found as deep as 1000 feet down off the coast of Alaska.



**Ospreys** build large nests from sticks. The nests sit atop or trees. They lay between one and five eggs at one time. The eggs don't hatch all at once though. The first egg hatches a few days before the last.



One of the largest turtles, the **sea turtle** has been on earth so long, they lived during the time of the dinosaurs. They can be found along the coastline of North America and more than 80 countries around the world.

Humpbacks are known for singing loud, complex "songs" – lasting up to 30 minutes long! The sounds they make are the most varied in the animal kingdom, ranging from high-pitched squeals and whistles to low, rumbling gurgles.





