## North America



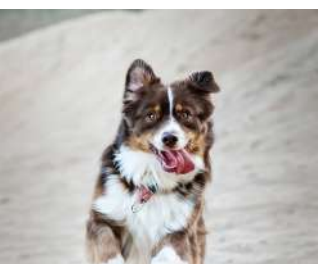
A bird with the biggest brain among all bird species in relation to the size of its body. The **crow** makes tools, using wire as hooks and spears. They are also known to drop shells on the road so cars will crack them.



**Pigs** have a reputation as being dirty and not the most clever of animals but they are actually very intelligent and clean. They use mud to cool off and protect themselves from sun damage.



**Squirrels** need to have a good memory because they bury nuts in order to have access to them later. However, sometimes they bury so many nuts they forget where some are and eventually these buried nuts turn into trees.



Dogs can learn up to 165 words, including gestures and signals, and some dogs can learn up to 250 words. Many dogs like sheepdogs are so intelligent that they are used to help farmers herd sheep.

The octopus gets its name from a Greek word which means eight-footed. They are very intelligent animals that can distinguish between shapes and patterns and have been known to even open jars using their tentacles.

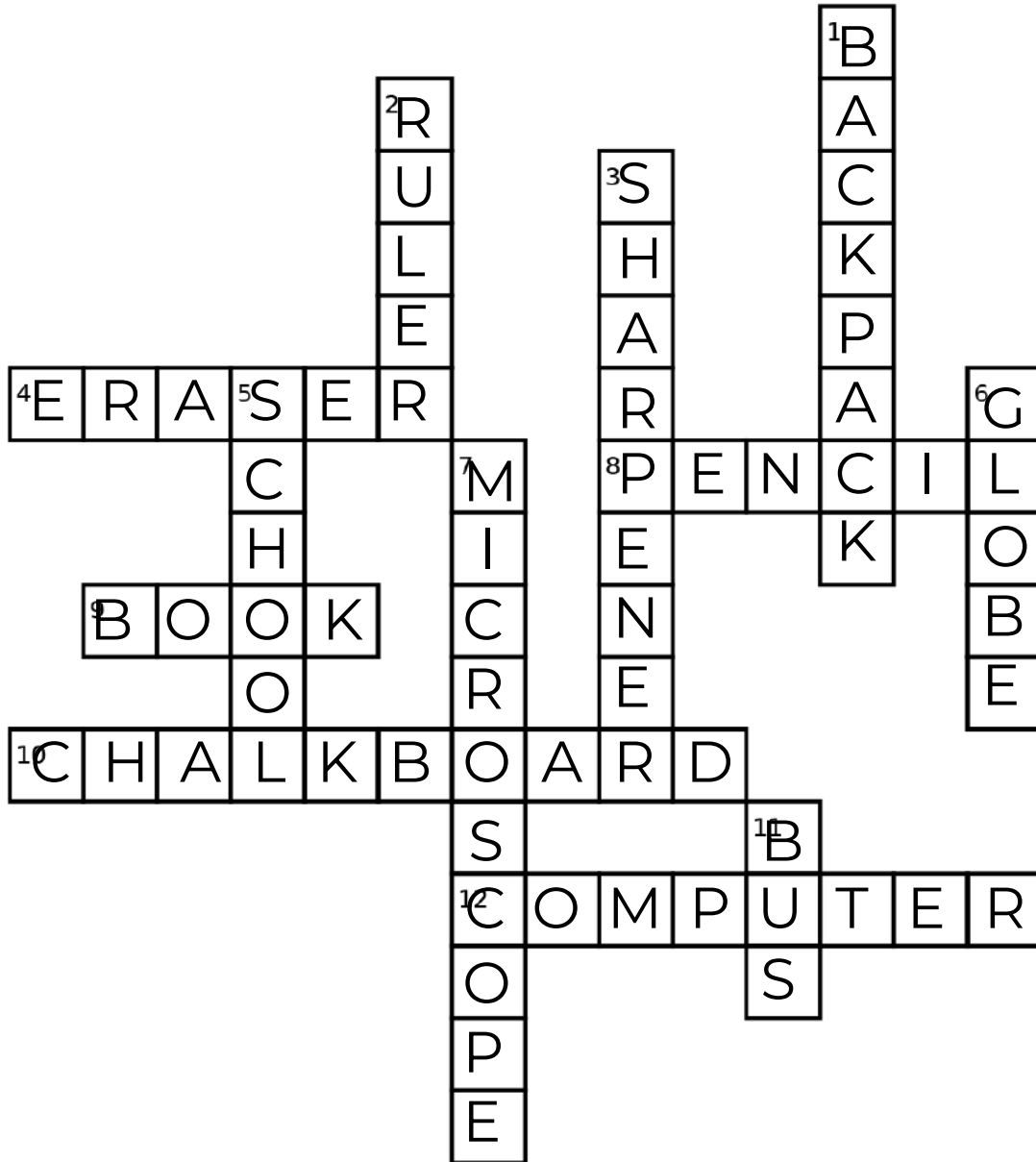
